## TEACHING, SCHOLORSHIP AND SERVICE FOR ACADEMIC YEAR 2019-2020

As a senior lecturer, my primary responsibility in the school is teaching. As such, my principle contribution to the continuing advancement of knowledge and capability in the classroom and in the profession, arises from the wealth of theoretical and technical developments emerging in the discipline. These are chosen for study and application to our classroom environment, in relation to our curriculum and the local and regional practice context. As a teaching collaborator, I steer these standard classroom topics toward the design interests and research topics of our faculty, so that the student's classroom experience not only stays current, but also connects more intimately to their own academic experience.

The most important aspect of my pedagogical work is to strive for a student's understanding of the relationship between a concept or an aesthetic idea as it pertains to the particular placement and configurations of the design elements and to the materials, construction methods, details and other realities and constraints that allow that ambition to come to fruition at the level of a project and a potential built work.

The task of teaching the complex process of design is something I am passionate about and strive to make assessable in my studio classes at various scales, from site planning and urban design, site design, to material and design details. I find these topics best explored particularly in the design courses that seeks to emphasize the integrative nature of landscape architecture with architecture, planning and environmental issues. Examples of how the process I describe above have affected these courses in recent years are the increased sophistication in possibilities of design disciplinary practices including formal, theoretical and technical factors as these affects form, space and organization and technical considerations. Value considerations found in current discourse, such as sustainability, storm water management, a deeper understanding of the integration of design and technology, and the significance of cultural and class diversity as these might challenge the notion of a single model of a desirable site design in various settings and augment the aforementioned theoretical foundations.

#### Scholarship

As a senior lecturer, scholarship is a consistent factor in the pedagogical development and class discourse. Two primary areas hold particular interest for me.

Site Planning is a broad area, impossible to define with simple categorizations. The expanse of this topic became easier to measure after developing five areas of focus which move across variations in scale, time, physical, social and economic contexts.

These five areas of focus are:

-The hidden magic of the plan.

-The untapped potential of section.

-Critical understanding of climate change.

-Social factors – implications and constructs.

-Enhancing "green" outcomes through the blurring site and architecture

Perhaps not as the sole author of a book on site planning, I would like to contribute chapters and edit a text which explores site planning from a more contemporary standpoint.

The second area is to garner greater understand of effective teaching methods. I would like to complete The OSU, Teaching Support Program offered through the University Institute for Teaching and Learning (UITL). My pedagogical interest focuses on teaching design. I would like to gain a deeper understanding of the factors that contribute to a student's ability to learn the complex process of design.

#### Service

- Currently, my only service responsibility is a resident director for OSU travel abroad trips
- Last year I was involved in both internal KSA and outside activities. I have been involved with curating the undergraduate landscape architecture student work on the website, to representative the outstanding student work with the knowledge the format will change in the near future.
- I worked with an alumnus to reach out to local design–build firms to establish summer internships, in an attempt to increase involvement with the KSA Office Assistanceship Program.
- I completed the OSU, REACH, suicide prevention training. Outside of school, I have completed a eight-week suicide prevention training course and volunteer six-hours (+) per week on a suicide prevention hotline. The support of the mental health of our students is something I care deeply about. I feel comfortable interacting with distressed students on a short-term basis until the student can obtain professional help.
